Class I - Diagnostic & Preventive Exams, X-Rays and Cleanings	Copays for services range from \$0-\$15; call plan for details
Class II - Restorative Restorations, Oral Surgery and Root Canals <i>(Note: If a posterior tooth is restored with a composite (white) filling, the plan will cover the cost up to the amount allowed for a tooth to be restored by an amalgam (silver) filling. Any difference in cost will be your responsibility.)</i>	Copays for services range from \$0-\$150; call plan for details
Class III – Major Crowns, Dentures and Bridges	Copays for services range from \$0-\$85, call plan for details, only base or noble metal covered for crowns
Annual Maximum & Deductible	No annual maximum or deductible.
Orthodontia Adults & Dependent Children	Copay maximum: children (to age 19) \$1,600, adults \$1,800 plus startup fees of \$350., adult coverage for students to age 25
Emergency Services (Immediate pain relief)	All emergency services must be coordinated through your selected DeltaCare dentist.

The DeltaCare plan offers you and your family an affordable choice for quality dental care. Washington Dental Service has contracted with a select network of dentists (both primary care dentists and specialists) who have agreed to provide a full range of benefits and high-quality care.

ACCESSING CARE

How to use your DeltaCare program

When you enroll you will need to choose a Dentist from the list of contracted Deltacare Providers. After you have enrolled, you will receive a membership card that will have the address and telephone number of your DeltaCare dentist. To receive all necessary dental care, simply contact your assigned DeltaCare primary care dentist to make an appointment.

Your DeltaCare dentist is responsible for coordinating all specialty care. Either he/she will perform the specialty treatment, or refer you to a DeltaCare network specialist. In some unique cases, your dentist may refer you to a non-network specialist, but prior authorization is required.

The DeltaCare program will not cover dental services that are not performed by your assigned DeltaCare office or properly referred to a DeltaCare specialist.

You may change DeltaCare dentists by contacting the Washington Dental Service DeltaCare unit and making your request by the 25th of the month. You may quickly locate a DeltaCare member dentist by accessing our on-line dental directory, located on our Internet web site at www.deltadentalwa.com/boeing. Our customer service representatives will assist you in the transfer, which will take effect the first day of the following month.

Using non-DeltaCare dentists

You are responsible for any dental bills incurred from dental treatment received from non-DeltaCare dentists. Washington Dental Service will reimburse up to \$50 for out-of-area emergency care received from licensed dentists for procedures to alleviate pain.
